This course also focuses on the importance of forgiveness to descendants of African slaves seeking healing from their personal and historical hurts.

Orton (Garfield Dean)	The student will be able to examine and understand some of the main foundations of Faith in God and his Word, with an emphasis on developing in the student an unfeigned faith, the revealed faith that will give a better understanding and strengthening of the foundations as we grow in wisdom and spiritual intelligence.
<b>ACADEMIC WRITINGS</b>	3	\$8,000	ZOOM	M 7:30 PM - 9:30 PM	Randolph Richards	An introduction to university-level standards of composition, research, and documentation. A review of English grammar (word and sentence level) and rhetorical forms (paragraph and beyond), and a study of the methods and conventions of academic argumentation and research with an emphasis on the skills and practices required to produce academic papers: finding and evaluating sources, formulating research questions, developing thesis statements, constructing arguments, and carrying out various types of analysis.
<b>CONFLICT MANAGEMENT AND RESOLUTION</b>	3	\$8,000	ZOOM	T 5:30 PM - 7:30 PM	Dr. Jeanitte Sydoine	This course examines causes of dysfunctional anger and conflict, and provides Biblically consistent principles and methods for management and prevention. The course provides for both acquisition of knowledge and development of interpersonal skills.
<b>NEW TESTAMENT SURVEY</b>	3	\$8,000	ZOOM	T 7:30 PM - 9:30 PM	Dr. Kelly Blanton	An introductory course surveying the books of the New Testament, not just the content and structure of each of the twenty-seven (27) books, but also their relevance to the believer's everyday life here on earth. Students will see the gradual revelation of the plan and purpose of the Almighty God. The purpose of this book is to move God's people into a deep relationship with God by getting to know Him through His word. Students will also discover how each book fits with every other book of the New Testament, making the Bible one incredible whole, bound together by the unbreakable cord of God's eternal purpose rather than a series of random books, bound together by a man-made cover.continuing from the Old Testament, through the pages of the New Testament.

Several models of evangelism will be explored, including both the content and the methods. Students will also be equipped to train others in evangelism.

It also provides a comprehensive introduction into various aspects of chaplaincy work in industrial and institutional settings.
